
Faith Presbyterian Church Room 201, 7 – 9 pm Fly – Big Eye Fly

Originated in the early 1980s by a UK fly tier, this pattern has rapidly gained popularity worldwide. It's certainly a non-traditional pattern and has an amazing bobbing and weaving action in the water. The pattern presented here is an attractor type patterns but any number of natural patterns can be tied with the bulbous eyes that give this fly its name. The foam at the eyes will let it float but it is sometimes fished on a sinking line with great success.



All are welcomed! Fly tying equipment is available for new tyers. Come and discover the joy of catching fish on a fly you tied or even designed. Join us for 2 hour sessions held on the 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month at 7 PM.



Mountain Home, Arkansas Spring Trip March 23-31, 2019

This trip coincides with the Sowbug Roundup (Mar. 28-30) a three day fly tying and fly fishing show held in Mountain Home Arkansas.

The Sowbug is basically a fly tying show that features demonstrations by 100+ expert tyers, seminars, tying & casting instruction, drawings, & auctions, not to mention local vendors as well as vendors from across the US to include Dave Whitlock, Davy Wotton, Duane Hada, and TFO rods.



TVFF is putting together to Mountain Home Arkansas from Saturday, Mar. 23 through following Sunday, Mar. 31. That's a 9 day and trip for ~\$450*. That's lodging, round trip transportation,, food and a 7 day Arkansas fishing license and trout stamp.

If you have never been to a blue ribbon trout river this is your opportunity to fish not one but two blue ribbon rivers for a fantastic price.

January and March 2019

TVFF Education Director, Donald Dehm, will be conducting a Fly Tying 101 Course in March 2019. This Course will be a set of three classes, held on three Saturdays, from 9 am - 1 pm each day. Please note that the event page and ticket may indicate only the date of March 9th, but the classes are for the three consecutive Saturdays of March 9, 16, and 23.

The classes in the course will include basic fly tying equipment identification, material identification, basic fly tying techniques, tying basic flies to intermediate flies (8 flies in total), and more. Each course will be limited to a total of 20 students either with their own equipment and/or with no equipment, which TVFF will provide at no cost.

Cost of the course is be \$25 per person, and we recommend that you attend all three classes. We will include all materials, to include hooks, thread, feathers, fur, and more for each student in attendance. You will also receive a physical copy of the information instructed as well as a digital copy (PDF) if requested. In addition, you will receive informed advice on what you can purchase to start out in fly tying, such as materials, equipment, vises, tools, etc.

Please be sure to select the box to let us know if you need TVFF to provide tools and a vise, or if you will be bringing your own.


Course Dates: March – 9, 16, and 23 (9 - 1 pm)

Coffee and assorted breakfast items will be provided at each date and included in ticket price.

Other Details:

TVFF membership is not required to attend these courses. The basic tools we recommend are threader, scissors, bobbin, bodkin, whip finisher, and hackle pliers. If you miss one date the. Please let the instructor know if you are unable to make any date and he may be able to schedule a make-up session on a TVFF Fly Tying night (2nd and 4th Thursdays). Children ages 10 and up can attend, however, we require at least one parent/guardian to also purchase tickets. Please keep in mind that we will be working with hooks and sharp tools, so safety is a concern. We will take restroom breaks on or around the top of each hour. The facility is handicap accessible, please contact Donald Dehm, donalddehm@yahoo.com for access to wheelchair accessible entrance. If the weather causes road closures, the classes for that day will be rescheduled and all attendees will receive an email with updated class information. You will receive an email the night before each class to remind you of the start time and other information for that day's class
